Children through age 5 who are enrolled in WCBDD services and their families (siblings through age 5 may also attend) are invited to attend a playtime event at our Milo H. Banta Center!



- Registration is required for Social Saturday
- Food is not permitted on the playground or in classroom
- Space will be limited to 15 people (to include up to 2 parents/caregivers per enrolled child's family)
- Social Saturday allows for families to remain 'socially connected' while maintaining safe limits
- Activities will take place outdoors as much as weather permits
- WCBDD will take precautions based on the current COVID-19 Community Level in our Warren County area. From CDC Website: "At all levels, people can wear a mask based on personal preference, informed by personal level of risk. People with symptoms, a positive test, or exposure to someone with COVID-19 should wear a mask". If Warren County Levels are 'Medium' WCBDD employees will be required to mask. If levels reach 'High' there will be no Social Saturday during that time. A health and safety check will be sent to all participants within 24 hours prior to each Social Saturday event.
